In 1972, a small group from Fruitland, Idaho, expressed interest in the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod (WELS). In 1973, Messiah Lutheran Church was established and designated as a mission congregation in Nampa, Idaho.

Today, Messiah is a congregation of over 300 baptized souls. When you come to Messiah on any given Sunday, you'll find a church family of all ages. Some members have been here for decades, others have been here for less than a year. Whatever your case may be, we gather around the unchanging Word of God as one family in *the* Messiah, Jesus Christ.

We gather today to praise our gracious God for his church and the many souls he has reached and is reaching through Messiah's ministries. We remember the past, which is a testimony of God's grace and power; we celebrate the present because "This is the day the Lord has made, let us rejoice and be glad in it!"
